ROBERT CAMPBELL WARDROP

Robert Campbell Wardrop was born the 16th of March 1828 in Stewarton, Ayrshire, Scotland, the son of James Lyle and Catharine Henderson Campbell Wardrop. He was the fourth son in a family of five boys and two girls.

Historical records show that Stewarton has existed since at least the 12th century with various non-historical references to the town dating to the early 11th century. The most famous of these concerns the legend of Mael Colimn the son of Donnchad I of Scotland who appears as a character in William Shakespeare's play Macbeth.

Robert was born into a noble household. The family had been farming the valley of Stewarton as far back as the 15th century. Robert's father, James, was a bonnet manufacturer. In those days they traveled about selling their goods. On one of James' trips he met Catherine Campbell, the daughter of Colen or Colin Campbell and Agnes Henderson, who were of royal Scots descent. When Catherine agreed to become James' wife, she was ostracized by her family.

Their children, including Robert, were well educated. Robert apprenticed as a stone mason. Two of his brothers, James and David also became stone masons.

The gospel of Jesus Christ as preached by the missionaries of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints was introduced in Scotland in 1839, first in Glasgow, later in Edinburgh. When Robert heard the message of the Restoration, he quickly accepted it after reading the Book of Mormon.

Robert was baptized into the Church, March 12, 1848, in Edinburgh, Scotland by David Cook, an Elder in Lockegby, Edinburgh. He was ordained to the office of a Teacher on the 17th of May 1848 under the hands of James Watson, the President of the branch at a Lockgeby, Edinburgh conference.


Robert's conversion incurred the wrath of his family who turned him away. However, they gave him enough money to immigrate to Utah. Is it possible that Catherine, who had been cut off from her own family because of her marriage, could now cut off her son because of his new faith? Robert never heard from his mother or father after he left Scotland, but his sister Janet wrote to him once a year with family news. Robert's brother, James, had previously immigrated to America in 1842 and resided in Michigan for some time. Another brother, William, went to India.

Robert left Scotland in January 1849, sailing aboard the ship *Hartley* embarking from Liverpool, England. William Hulme, President of the Latter-day Saints on board the *Hartley* reported the voyage was more like a pleasure excursion, perhaps an exaggeration. "The weather had been so pleasant and the sea and wind so gentle that only one or two rough days had been experienced in the crossing." The *Hartley* docked at New Orleans on April 28th 1849, 54 days after leaving Liverpool.

In Council Bluffs, Iowa he bought a team of oxen, but when he got to Utah, he had to sell them so that he could live.

By 1850 Robert had found employment as a stone cutter.

The 1850 federal census enumerated him at age 23 in a household with two other young men, Ira Hillman, 23, also a stone cutter and Lafayette Noe, 19, a wheelwright.



He took part in church activities and was Seventy. Not long after this he met Margaret Owens, an immigrant from Wales. She was employed as a cook for the workers at a construction site. When they got acquainted Robert and Margaret were both amazed and delighted to discover that they had actually sailed on the same ship to cross the ocean, but had not met previously.



They were married the 3rd of June 1851 in Salt Lake City. They were later sealed in the Endowment House the 13th of August 1854.

Their first five children were born in Salt Lake City: Mary Ellen 1852, Robert 1854 (died aged 8 months), Catherine 1855, Margaret 1857 and Jane 1859.

After the construction began on the Salt Lake temple in 1853 Robert found employment as a skilled stone mason. Later, as a master stone mason, he was responsible for all the stone coping around the doors and windows of the east side of the temple.

Robert also worked as a stone cutter on the courthouse at Fillmore, Utah.

Margaret and Robert Wardrop were married for three years before Robert took a second wife, a custom then widely practiced in the territory by members of the Mormon faith. The wedding took place in the Endowment House on August 13th 1854, the same date that Robert and his first wife, Margaret, were sealed, in a ceremony that would link them forever in this life and the next.

The second wife's name was Mary Reese Morris, a widow with four children, whose husband, Ebenezer Morris, had died in Wales, prior to her immigration in 1853. Mary and Ebenezer Morris had seven children, three of which died young. They were Margaret, John, David, Joseph Smith, Hyrum, Mormon and Gomer Morris. Her four surviving children immigrated with Mary. She was almost 7 years older than her new husband and her "sister" wife. Perhaps this marriage more nearly conformed to the ideal of providing for the widows and the fatherless than many of the other polygamous unions among their peers. No mention is made of how Margaret felt about her husband taking a second wife, but it is likely she was consulted prior to the event and granted a consent that may or may not have been reluctant.

The family moved to Brigham City, Utah in late 1859 or early 1860 where a son, William, was born to Margaret and Robert in 1861. The United States federal census of 1860 shows a single household with all 13 family members enumerated. By that time Margaret had given birth to five children, and Mary to three Wardrop children. In their household there were two two-year-olds, two three-year-olds, two four-year-olds, two 8-year-olds and two teenagers!³



The family lived in Brigham City, Utah, for a short time and then moved to Wellsville, Utah in the spring of 1863. Many of the Scottish families had gravitated to Wellsville, and it was known as "Scotch Town" around Cache Valley, Utah.

Robert took up making slates and pencils for the school children of the county from slate he quarried in Harper's Canyon north of Brigham City. They lived in a dugout their first year there, and when Wellsville City was laid out, they moved about seven blocks south into the "New Fort" area. In 1874 Robert built the first log house at the mouth of Wellsville Canyon near Mt. Sterling, 4 as part of a homestead where he raised hogs and dairy cattle. He also made grindstones and headstones from stone found in Wellsville Canyon. The family assisted him in this endeavor, sandpapering the finish on the stones, slates, and pencils. It was tedious and painstaking work.

The federal census of 1870 indicated that the Wardrops by that time had split into two households, Robert living with Margaret, at least as far as the census was concerned, and Mary as head of her own separate household.

The same arrangement existed in the 1880 census as well.⁵ The latter census indicated that Margaret and Robert Wardrop were living next door to their daughter, Jane Wardrop Duncan and her family. Jane had married Moroni Duncan in 1875 and had two children by 1880.

Robert, the father of 17 children, passed away September 24, 1884 at the age of 60, and was buried in the Wellsville Cemetery. The cause of his death has not been determined.

Deseret News, Oct. 10, 1888 p. 624, Col. 5 (Family History Library film # 0026603):

Deaths – Wardrop -- On Monday Sept. 24th, 1888 at his residence in Wellsville at the age of 69 years 7 months and 8 days Robert Wardrop; born at Stewarton, Ayrshire, Scotland, and joined the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in 1848; came to Salt Lake City in the fall of 1849 where he was employed as a stone cutter on the Temple and other public works for some years, when he moved to Cache Valley and engaged in the occupation of farming – Logan Journal

Other data may be obtained from the Early Church Information File.⁷



Mary Morris Wardrop had passed away six months prior to Robert on the 27 of March, 1888. She, too, was buried in the Wellsville Cemetery, predeceased by three of her Morris children and one Wardrop child, Janet Reece Wardrop who died at the age of five in 1862.

The Wardrop family stayed in Wellsville after the death of Robert. Margaret enjoyed her family and her home, kept a tidy house and raised wonderful gardens of flowers and vegetables. However, it must be noted that she and Robert were pre-deceased by several children: Robert died as a 10-month-old infant in 1854, the same age as Owen in 1866. Allen died in 1874 as a 5-year-old, and Rachel died the following year at the same age. Two of Margaret's adult children died before she did: Alice died of diphtheria at age 31 in 1897 and William was killed in Reno, Nevada in 1908 at age 47. It will also be noted that Margaret passed away at the home of her daughter in Salt Lake City April 1st 1913 at the age of 84. She was buried in Wellsville, Cache County, Utah.

Not enough can be said about our amazing pioneer ancestors. The Wardrops were magnificent examples of loving and contributing to the well-being of each other, their communities, their faith—courageous, committed and enduring to the end.
